## MOOSE DAY

COTTAGE GROVE

## Saturday, February 24



IT IS MY DESIRE AT THIS time to tell you a story of the history of Moosedom. We were organized in the year 1888 and succeeded in reaching the high water mark at one time of 34,000. Then our troubles began; disintegration set in and we dwindled down until, in 1906, we had only 243 members in two lodges in the United States.

At that time we reorganized, adopted a new constitution and by-laws and success attended our efforts. We increased by leaps and bounds until in 1913 we were so strong that we began to cast about for new fields to conquer and a larger work to do; so committees were appointed and after much time spent in earnest thought it was decided that an Industrial Home for the orphans of our members would be as high and lofty a work as we could accomplish. Accordingly a site 35 miles west of Chicago was selected, consisting of 1014 acres of fertile land and on July 27, 1913, Vice President Thomas R. Marshall dedicated our Home and gave unto it the name of "MOOSEHEART," thus creating an institution which not only ennobled us anew, but one which will go down to posterity as one of the greatest works of which man in all his wisdom is capable. Since our Home was instituted we have grown and grown until we now rank third among the thirty-two recognized fraternal societies of the world today.

To quote the words of William Jennings Bryan: "The men who conceived 'Mooseheart' and helped to make it possible have builded better than they knew, and I am proud to be one of the members of such a grand organization and to give it my aid and support."

We have today over four hundred children at Mooseheart, and are teaching them 24 different trades and crafts under competent and skilled instructors.

Space will not permit me to go into further detail, however much I would like to do so, but before closing I wish to impress upon everyone who reads this history that this will be the last opportunity for Cottage Grove men to secure admission into our organization for the small sum of \$5.00. To you town and out-of-town men especially I offer one last chance to become a Moose. Any application received until Saturday night will be accepted. Our age limits are 21 to 50 years for beneficial members. Over 50 years we are glad to welcome you as social members.

Cottage Grove Lodge 1559 guarantees you, in case of sickness or accident, \$5.00 per week the first four weeks, and \$10.00 per week for nine weeks thereafter, and \$100 at death. All this for the small sum of \$10 per year—less than three cents per day.
