GENERAL OFFENSIVE BEGUN BY RUSSIANS

Washington.—The whole Russian front from the gulf of Riga to Roumania is reported in official dispatches from Petrograd to the Russian embassy here to be alive with battle. The Germans are said to be rushing troops from the Italian and French fronts and to be entirely rearranging their positions.
On the northern front near Riga German reinforcements are rushing up by sea transport. On the Lemberg front the troops are being shifted back and forth by means of heavy automobiles in an attempt to prevent further advances by General Korniloff. On the southern front, in the Carpathians, the Austrians are said to be in full flight.
Although the movement of the Russian infantry engaged in General Korniloff's big offensive in eastern Galicia is being hampered by bad weather, the Cossacks apparently have been able to keep up their dashing tactics. This is indicated by the report that the town of Dolina has been occupied by Russian forces.

REPUBLICANS TAKE PEKIN

Complete Restoration of Republic is Indicated by Decisive Victory.
Washington.—The occupation of Pekin by the republican forces, following the surrender at Fung Tai of the Monarchist army of 10,000 men, indicates the complete restoration of the republic, the Chinese legation here declared.
Order in the capital was restored with few casualties. The advisers said that two foreign civilians and four foreign soldiers who ventured to the firing line were slightly wounded.
Chang Hsun, who led the revolt of the imperialists, took refuge in the Dutch legation in order to obtain safe conduct out of the country. Premier Tuan Chi Jul will establish republican headquarters in Pekin immediately, it is said.
German Attacks Repelled.
Paris.—A strong series of German attacks between the Somme and the Aisne and in the Champagne were repulsed everywhere except near Mont Haut in the Champagne, where they retained a few trench elements, the war office announced.
Russians' Advance Captures Villages.
Petrograd.—On a front of nearly 50 miles from Halez to the foothills of the Carpathians the Russians have advanced westward across the Lomnica and north across the Dniester, capturing several villages and important enemy positions.
1200 I. W. W.'s Placed in Camp.
Columbus, N. M.—The 1200 Industrial Workers of the World banished from Bisbee arrived here from Hermans, N. M., and were placed under guard of United States troops.
Colorado Woman N. E. A. President.
Portland, Ore.—Mary C. C. Bradford, superintendent of schools of Colorado, was elected president of the N. E. A. at the annual business meeting.

RECIPES FOR KILLING FLIES

The United States government makes the following suggestions for the destruction of house flies:
Formaldehyde and sodium salicylate are the two best fly poisons. Both are superior to arsenic. They have their advantages for household use. They are not a poison to children; they are convenient to handle, their dilutions are simple and they attract flies.
A formaldehyde solution of approximately the correct strength may be made by adding three teaspoonfuls of the concentrated formaldehyde solution commercially known as formalin, to a pint of water. Similarly, the proper concentration of sodium salicylate may be obtained by dissolving 3 teaspoonfuls of the pure chemical (a powder) in a pint of water.
A container that has been found convenient for automatically keeping the solution always available for flies to drink is made as follows: Take a thin-walled drinking glass and fill or partially fill it with the solution. A saucer, or small plate, in which is placed a piece of white blotting paper cut the size of the dish, is put bottom up over the glass. The whole is then quickly inverted, a match placed under the edge of the glass, and the container is ready for use. As the solution dries out of the dish the liquid seal at the edge of the

glass is broken and more liquid flows into the lower receptacle. Thus the paper is always kept moist.
Borax is especially valuable around farms and out of doors. One pound of borax to 12 bushels of manure will be found desirable as a poison without injuring its manurial qualities or farm stock. Scatter the borax over the manure and sprinkle with water.
Lye, chloride of lime, or copperas (sulphate of iron) dissolved in water, crude carbolic acid, or any kind of disinfectant, may be used in vaults.
