In 1962 in Cottage Grove, he and Judith Ann DeYoung were married.

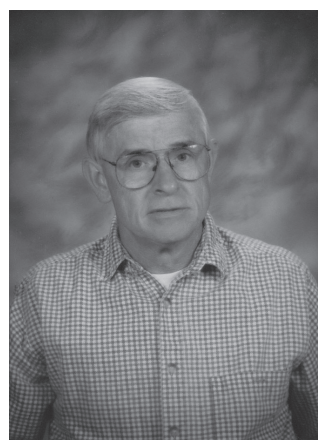

viewed as evidence of an advancing economy, and City Planner Amanda Ferguson said that applications for building permits for new homes have been "coming in steadily in the new year." The City has issued permits for three new single-family dwellings and one new accessory dwelling unit since Jan. 1, according to Community Development Director Howard Schesser.

"It's definitely looking up compared to where it was two years ago," Ferguson said.

The City's Planning Depart-

ment has been a part of several pre-applications for new commercial developments, Ferguson said, though these are of course not definitive at this stage.

"There is an application for some interesting apartments, which is good because occupancy rates downtown are very high and it would be nice to have more apartments downtown," she said. She added that the City was also expected to begin marketing the former Side Pocket Foods building in the City's Industrial Park this week, and parties have already indicated an interest in the massive structure.
