service outside the city limits," he said. Many of the rural residents affected reside close to the city limits, and Alverson said they amount to about 4.5 percent of the company's rate base.

"We could have raised the rates for all of our customers to cover the costs, but we didn't think it was fair to the rest of our ratepayers to cover a cost incurred by a small percent-

age of the base," he said.

Alverson said the Garbage Service has been letting its rural customers know about the change, many by telephone. He said that Lane County still has a contract with Ecosort to not pay fees to the company at its transfer stations, and he suggested that rural residents take their recycling to the London or Sears Road stations, which are open Saturday and Monday through Saturday, respectively.

Children Playing With Fire...

### The 5th Leading Cause of Human-caused Wildfires

There are many children in Oregon who are curious about fire and set one as a result of the curiosity. There are other children who use fire setting to get even with someone with whom they are struggling. Regardless of the child, the adults in the home are responsible for the damage caused from the result of a child's actions.

Parents, do you have any idea how much it costs to suppress a wildfire set by a child? In the past five years, 21 fires set by children burned 8 acres and cost \$53,501 to suppress on state protected lands in Oregon.

Juvenile-set fires are the fifth-leading cause of human-caused wildfires on state protected lands in Oregon. It is critical to keep matches and lighters out of the hands of children. Children are naturally curious, and if the opportunity arises, they may use the dry grass out behind the house to see what the match can really do. The wind picks up the fire and a wildfire results.

Matches and lighters are tool, not toys. They are for adults to use to light the fireplace, light candles on birthday cakes or light barbecues. Keep all matches, lighters, and other types of igniters up high and out of your child's reach.

"This is absolutely the responsibility of the adults in the home," said Kristin Babbs, President/CEO of Keep Oregon Green Association. "They, and only they, are responsible for keeping igniters away from their children." Parents are responsible for the damages and suppression costs of not more than \$5,000 that result from a wildfire set by their child (ORS 477.745).
