It was not a typical build up or preparation this year for Macauley. Earlier in the year she assumed she would skip out on the competition due to several kidney issues she has recently suffered from. But with the support and encouragement of her husband, Ed Macauley, she was convinced to reach her full potential and signed up for the competition. The problem was, however, that she didn't have much time to prepare.

"I only had eight weeks to prepare where I would train two to three times a day," she said. "Most people wouldn't do

that."

Macauley's husband is a nine-time world champion, however he decided to take this year off in order to help his wife train in the short period of time that she had.

"I've received so much support from this community and especially my husband, he really pushed me and helped me get to where I want to be."

Macauley lifted 170 pounds, a similar weight to her 2014 first place-winning performance, and less than 100 pounds away from the world record of 264.5, held by Beverly Anolin of Calif.

Macauley originally began competing for the memory of

her daughter, who tragically died in a car accident some years ago. After having such great success in her first year, her husband signed her up for the second year in a row and won yet again. This year Macauley pulled off the same results but with a shorter training period and a medical setback.

"We can have a lot of setbacks but you simply just can't let that hold you back," Macauley said. "I just want to thank everybody in the community for their support and say a special thank you to my husband for his love and support in everything I do."
