The Lions struggled even more so against North Marion. Of the 15 matches, Cottage Grove only came out victorious in three of them, one from a forfeit. Andrew Bordeaux managed to pin Damian Chavez in the first period, and Elijah Farrell finished by pinning Ramon Organiz in the second period.

Kripeerapan found redemption by pinning Haleigh Wagman in the first period. North Valley ultimately ended with six forfeits, giving the Lions an easy 64-16 win.

The dual against Phoenix was much closer and was a great Triumph for Cottage Grove. Boitz was able to pin Elijah Leonis in the first period after Phoenix started out ahead with a pin and a decision win. Allen then similarly pinned his opponent in the first period directly after Boitz.


