Cottage Grove led for most of

the game and went into the locker room at halftime up by three in a tight 27-24 contest.

After a long third quarter of fighting off the Fishermen and preventing them from taking the lead, the Lions unraveled and were outscored 20-9 in the fourth quarter, losing 55-46.

"It's hard to say, we just had some very uncharacteristic turnovers," Pollard said. Although Cottage Grove had great efforts with 16 points from Blake Sentman and another 15 from Parent, the Lions were unable to finish off Astoria and finished in sixth place.
