Jayden Tucker, Connor Howard, Konrad Raum and Tucker Porter were all invited to compete in the high school exhibition. In a heat of six teams from classes 1A to 4A, student-athletes from Cottage Grove competed in a 4x400-meter relay event. The Lions took home third place with a little bit of rust in their technique, but Knutson says that it was more about the experience than anything else.

"The kids will probably never get to do anything like this again for the rest of their lives," he said. The IAAF World Indoor Championships happen every other year (except for 2003 and 2004, where the tournament switched from odd years to even years). The last time these championships were held in the United States was 1987 in Indianapolis' Hoosier Dome, only the second championship ever hosted. Since then, it has been held all over Europe and parts of the Middle East, making this opportunity an extremely rare one for local high school athletes.

The National Championships were held the weekend before, where several other Lions were invited to compete in a high school meet that featured athletes from all over the Northwest. However, with the international implication in this meet, Knutson said the event was overall much more formal and serious.

"The security was very much heightened and the kids were treated very respectfully," he said. According to Knutson, even sitting in the waiting area was a great experience as the high school athletes mingled next to world-class professionals from all over the world.

While the relay team didn't necessarily perform as best as they could, the more important aspect of the trip was to simply be a part of the whole experience and enjoy a professional and international perspective on the sport they enjoy themselves.

Looking forward, Frieze says the defense will begin to step up as the pitchers learn consistency in their game.


