Final Notice and Public Explanation of a Proposed Activity in a 100-Year Floodplain and Wetlands

City of Yoncalla
 To: All interested Agencies include all interested Agencies, FEMA, HUD, City of Yoncalla, Douglas County, Oregon. Groups and Individuals

This is to give notice that the City of Yoncalla has conducted an evaluation as required by Executive Order 11988 and 11990, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management, to determine the potential affect that its activity in the floodplain and wetland will have on the human environment for **The City of Yoncalla Wastewater System Improvement Project**. The project is for the construction of a new influent pump station and force main that conveys flow from the City of Yoncalla to the City's wastewater treatment lagoons. The new piping replaces the existing undersized wastewater collection system and prevents sanitary sewer overflows.

The project will include wastewater collection improvements and effluent disposal improvements; a new influent pump station, new force main that conveys wastewater to the lagoon treatment system, an effluent outfall pipe and initial infrastructure for a future recycled water irrigation system.

The City of Yoncalla proposes construction of a new influent pump station (at a new location) that utilizes three new submersible pumps, a new control building, a new power generator, new pump controls, new alarm and telemetry system devices, electronic hoist, a new security fence and minor site improvements. An existing gravity sewer main will be intercepted and diverted to the new pump station. The remnant gravity line, existing pump station and existing force main will be decommissioned and remain in place.

A manual bar screen will replace the lagoon inlet structure. Lagoon and effluent piping upgrades include increasing the capacity of the north/south lagoon inter-connection piping and upsizing the effluent discharge piping. Proposed infrastructure for the treatment plant are for the future land application of recycled water on the surrounding farm land. This infrastructure will include an irrigation pump station wet well and a recycled water force main.

The project will be located on properties owned by The City of Yoncalla in Douglas County, Oregon, 97499 on Tax Maps T22S R05W S34 TL 2100 & 2200 and T23S R05W S03 TL 700,600 & 1801 and is almost entirely within the 100-year floodplain and palustrine emergent wetlands. The total project area is approximately .28 acre. The total number of acres of floodplains is approximately .28 acre and the total area of wetlands is approximately 5,330 square feet.
