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were 53 participants in the regular Olympic tri and 38-year old Annick Chalier, clocking in at 2:18:30.7. Chalier's split times were 27:20, 1:04:17 and 44:51. The main attractions of the race were professional racers Guy Crawford, Chris Ganter and Kate Bevilaqua. Crawford and Bevilaqua currently hold the course record for male and female and have now won the

event for the third time in a row. However, neither managed to break their record this year. Crawford finished with a time of 1:53:49.1, two minutes slower than his previous time in 2015. Crawford completed the swimming part of the course in just 20 minutes and five seconds, while he was the only competitor to finish the Olympic bike section in under an hour at 56 minutes and 31 seconds. He clocked in a run time of 35:52. Bevilaqua finished in 2:11:18.8, six min-

utes slower than her record-setting time last year. Chris Ganter finished just behind Crawford in 1:58:13.8. Crawford, from New Zealand, trains all year in Australia and the United States and says he loves the Rolf Prima Tri in Cottage Grove. "It's always a great time and it's beautiful here," he said. Shortly after completing the course, Crawford said he had a little help during the swimming leg of the race. "I think I hooked on to someone's toe and kind of pulled me in at the end," he said laughing, "I'll have to find him and thank him for that."

The sprint triathlon featured 71 male racers ranging from as young as 10 to as old as 73. Aleck Norland was the youngest competitor with a time of 1:37:14.7, and Michael Bansmer, 73, finished in 1:50:38.8. First place went to 17-year old Andy Kreuger who finished in 1:01:08.6. The female racers totaled 78 and ranged from age 10 to 69. Sisters Kate and Hannah Middleton finished the sprint triathlon as the two youngest females. Tami Martin took first place for the women with a time of 1:15:08.4. The event was another great success with a lot of positive feedback. Best in the West events owner and director Blair Bronson says the event is growing in popularity and would ultimately like to see it cap out at 500 participants.

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
