He came to Cottage Grove from Chehalis, Washington, married a local, Anella Martin, and had six children. Gene was a timber faller and owned a farm and also a member of the London Grange. Around 1968 he organized one of the first Logging shows for the WOE Fair, a tradition that carries on

today. He was passionate about preserving the heritage and history of the areas logging traditions. For over 40 years Gene organized and helped run the logging show. Without his commitment and tireless effort there would be no Fair or Logging show.
