

DIVISION A-TEXTILES

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RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Exhibitors are requested to read carefully the Fair rules and regulations in the front of this book. All general rules apply to each division.
2. Articles submitted to the fair must be the hand-work of the exhibitor.
3. All entries must have been completed within the year following the last fair.
4. Exhibits consisting of more than one piece must be securely fastened together.
5. Entries **MUST BE CLEAN AND PRESSED OR BLOCKED**, to be accepted as exhibits.
6. Pictures and wall hangings must be finished and ready to hang.
7. Only amateurs may exhibit for competition. Professionals (those who earn more than 50% of their income for their work) are encouraged to display their work for exhibit.

STANDARDS FOR JUDGING

- Workmanship in relation to pattern and fabric. 40%
- Suitability of purpose and/or occasion. 20%
- General appearance, neatness, blocking, pressing cleanliness, etc 20%
- Harmony of colors & materials. 20%

CLASSES/ SUBSECTIONS

All of the textile classes have the following sections:

- ◆ Seniors' (over 65)
- ◆ Ladies'
- ◆ Men's
- ◆ Juniors' (13/10, 9/6, 5/0)
- ◆ Antique Pieces

Your exhibit will be classified at the time of entry and by class and section.

AWARDS

1st, 2nd and 3rd ribbon awards will be issued for judged exhibits in each class and subsection. In addition, the following "Best" awards will be issued:

- ◆ Best of Antique Pieces
- ◆ Best of Senior
- ◆ Best of Junior
- ◆ Best of Quilting
- ◆ Best of Crochet or Knit
- ◆ Best Use of Theme
- ◆ Best of Holiday
- ◆ Best of Show - Textiles

CLASS 1 — THEME OF FAIR

May be any Textiles exhibit item (quilt, crochet, artistic handwork, etc) that displays the current theme of the fair. This will be determined at the time of entry.

CLASS 2 — CROCHET

- Lot 1 - Doilies, under 14 inches
- Lot 2 - Centerpiece, 14 in. or over a.
- Lot 3 - Table Linens
- Lot 4 - Kitchen items (pot holders, towels)
- Lot 5 - Bathroom Items (tissue holders, hand towels, etc.)
- Lot 6 - Edging or Lace
- Lot 7 - Pillows (must be filled and finished)
- Lot 8 - Afghans
- Lot 9 - Infant blankets or afghans
- Lot 10-Baby garments
- Lot 11-Children's garments
- Lot 12-Adult garments
- Lot 13-Toys
- Lot 14- Any felted item
- Lot 15-Dolls
- Lot 16-Any other crocheted item.

CLASS 3 — KNIT

- Lot 1 - Doilies, under 14"
- Lot 2 - Centerpiece, over 14"
- Lot 3. Table Linens
- Lot 4 - Pillows (must be filled and finished)
- Lot 5 - Infant blankets or afghans
- Lot 6 - Baby garments
- Lot 7 - Children's garments
- Lot 8 - Adult garments
- Lot 9 - Toys
- Lot 10-Dolls
- Lot 11- Any item knitted with home spun yarn.
- Lot 12- Any item knitted with a knitting machine.
- Lot 13- Any felted item.
- Lot 14- Any other knitted item.

- Lot 1 - Doilies, under 14 inches
- Lot 2 - Centerpiece, over 14inches
- Lot 3 - Table linens
- Lot 4 - Edging
- Lot 5 - Any other tatted item

CLASS 5 — ARTISTIC HANDWORK

- Lot 1 - Needlepoint
- Lot 2 - Embroidery

CLASS 6 - QUILTING

- Lot 1- Hand pieced & quilted
- Lot 2 - Hand pieced & machine quilted
- Lot 3 - Machine pieced & quilted
- Lot 4 - Machine pieced and Hand quilted
- Lot 5 - Hand-tied
- Lot 6 - Old quilt top-recently finished
- Lot 7 - Quilted garments
- Lot 8 - Novelty items-quilted
- Lot 9 - Whole cloth quilt

CLASS 7 - SEWING

- Lot 1 - Cotton Fabric a. Aprons
- Lot 2 - Knit fabrics a. Infant clothing
- Lot 3 - Decorative clothing
