

Suspect in Brice Creek standoff arrested

A suspect sought since reports of a neighborhood dispute in the 39900 block of Brice Creek Road south-east of Cottage Grove brought a heavy police presence to the area was arrested by Lane County Sheriff's Deputies last week.

Sgt. Carrie Carver announced via press release last week that Dakota Miller was taken into custody on Monday, Aug. 29 after he turned himself in to the Sheriff's Office. Miller was lodged at the Lane County Jail on charges of Unlawful Use of a Weapon, two counts of Menacing, Harassment and two charges of Attempting to Elude Police.

Sheriff's Office received a report of a dispute at a home near Disston. Initial information indicated that a shot had been fired in relation to the ongoing dispute between neighbors, a dispute that had brought the Sheriff's Office to the home one week prior.

The Sheriff's Office Special Response team was called out to respond due to the nature of the call and the history with the involved parties. Upon arrival, the 25-year old Miller fled the area on foot. The Special Response Team searched the area with the assistance of a Springfield Police Department K-9 Unit but did not locate Miller.

During that incident, Shelia Miller of Dorena was taken into custody for Hindering Prosecution, Resisting Arrest and Interfering with Police and was transported to the Lane County Jail.

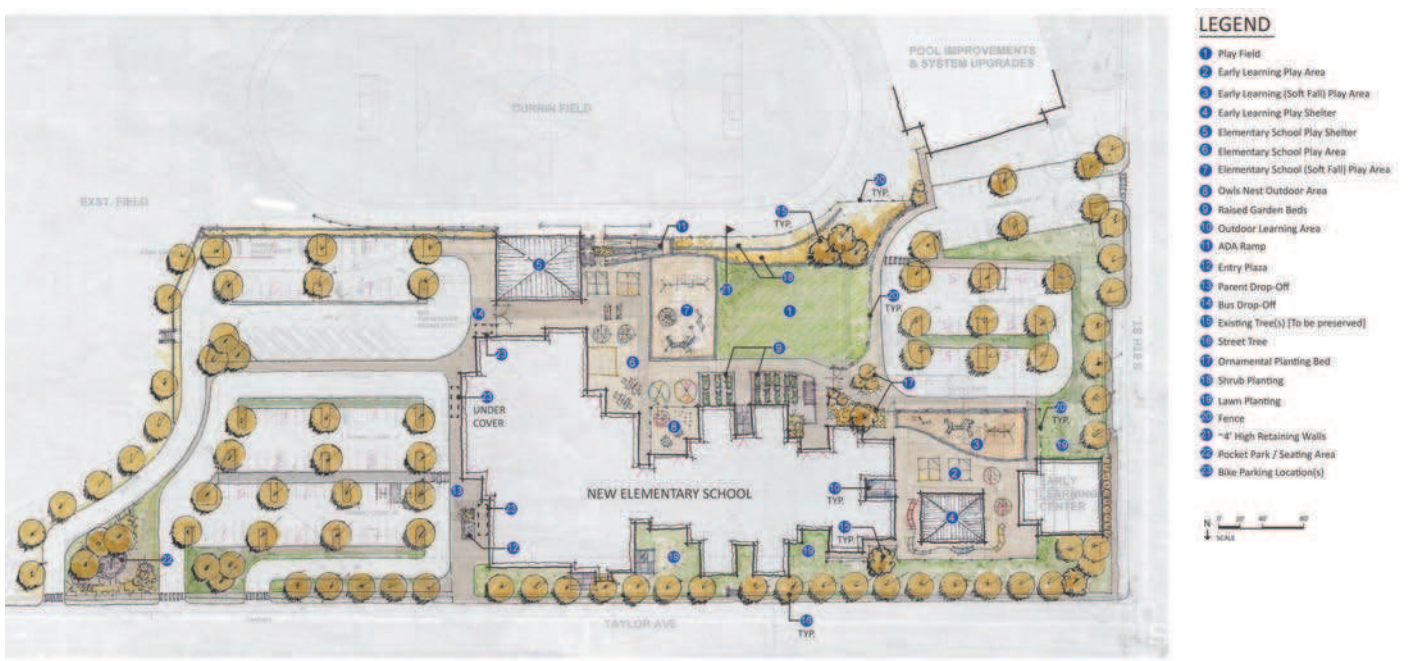
Nguyen said Delight will stick with its regular offerings but now also offers secondhand clothing on consignment for adults and young adults.

Nguyen said that many of the store's regular customers offered to help out with the move.

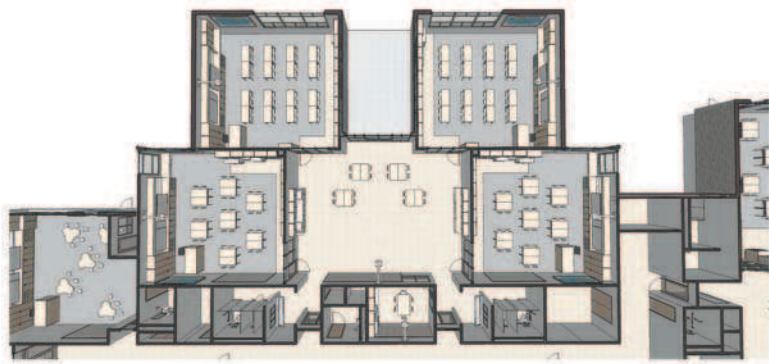
"It's a lot of work for our little mom-and-pop shop and we feel blessed to have this community support from our 'extended family,'" she wrote.

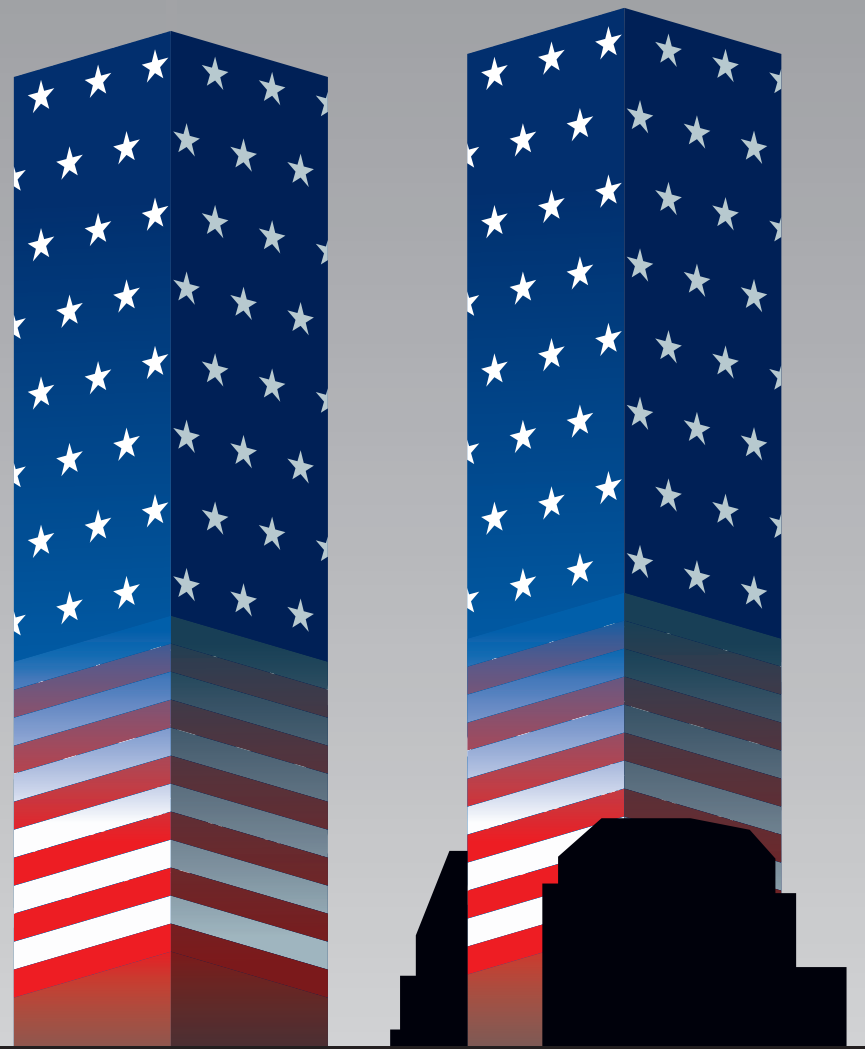


The open timber frame design in this rendering of one of the school's hallways is meant to call to mind the frames of the area's famed covered bridges.
