Volunteer ombudsmen sought

The Office of the Long-Term Care Ombudsman is currently accepting applications for Volunteer Ombudsmen in Lane County. The Office of the Long-Term Care Ombudsman advocates for the rights of Oregonians living in licensed long-term care and residential facilities. Their mission is to enhance the quality of life; improve the level of care; protect individual rights and promote the dignity of each Oregon citizen living in a long-term care facility.

The Office said the need for Volunteer Ombudsman in Lane County is great. According to its press release, only 50 percent of the 160 nursing facilities, assisted living facilities and residential care facilities have an Ombudsman assigned to them, leaving many vulnerable residents without the advocacy and protection they need. The Office of the Long-Term Care Ombudsman provides Volunteer Ombudsmen with training, certification and continuing support.
