



Lions upset Fishermen with fourthquarter comeback, advance to semifinals

Down 14-3 at the start of the final quarter, Cottage Grove made clutch plays to steal a win from third-ranked Astoria

Cottage Grove racked up another victory like they've been doing all season, but this win came in a much different fashion. The Lions have won by an average margin of 34 points this season, their closest game coming from Scappoose in a 24-21 win.

This was the first time Cottage Grove had trailed a game. Teams have tied the Lions, but Cottage Grove has never had to fight from behind, let alone trail for three quarters.

The Lions were down 14-3 as the fourth quarter started. They outscored Astoria 22-7 in the final quarter to seal a 25-21 quarterfinal victory.

Both offenses struggled all game, and the score was only 7-3 at the end of the first half. The Fishermen came back out and scored in the third quarter, and Cottage Grove found themselves behind two scores entering the fourth quarter.

But Astoria wasn't ready for what the Lions were about to unleash. A 22-point quarter was not what the Fishermen were expecting.

However, in a fierce Cottage Grove rally, Sentman hit Zane Levings and Kory Parent for touchdowns, shrinking the Lions' deficit to only three points. After forcing the Fishermen to punt, the Lions found themselves in yet another fourth-down situation. But Sentman and Woods connected on a 13-yard gain for a first down. The very next play, Woods caught yet another pass, and he used his finesse to waltz into the endzone for the go-ahead touchdown. His teammates swarmed him after the score.

"I just wanted to score and win," he said after the game.
