#### Money runs out, SL schools close

South Lane students and employees went home fr an aextended Thanksgiving vacation yesterday. Because of a lack of operating revenue, district schools must remain closed at least until Jan. 14, pending the outcome of another election, Jan. 11.

Only a skeletal crew of nine employees will continue to work during the closure, providing basic caretaker services. The district office at 103 S. 5th St. will remain open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays.

Jule Crume, the district's director of instructional services, announced Monday that workbooks in basic areas (spelling, reading, math) for students in grades 1-8 are still available at the district office for two dollars. She said some supplementary texts for all grade levels are also available at the district office on a first-come first-serve

All student records have been updated, and all elementary schools have sent their files and records to the district office, Miss Crume added.

District employees will be able to sign up for the unemployment insurance Monday from 1 to 5 p.m. at Bohemia School. Any employee who is unable to sign up Monday can do so at any state employment office on Tuesday or any day thereafter.

supplemental payroll for the school district is also planned for Dec. 15. According to a district spokesman, a supplemental payroll is necessary because there was not enough time for the staff to compute all the figures in time for the November payroll.

(It is a South Lane policy to make monthly payroll based on 12 equal payments. Each month during the school year, teachers are actually earning more money than they are receiving. The difference is made up in June when they are paid the remainder of their contract.)

On or about Dec. 15, teachers will be paid the balance of what they have earned through No-


