First Baptists prepare to call new pastor

t's a new era in the 107-year-old his-Ltory of Cottage Grove's First Baptist Church as church members prepare to launch their first pastoral search in more than three decades. Longtime pastor Steve Johnson and his wife Mercy retired in May. In July, the First Baptist's church board hired Reed Webster to serve as an Intentional Interim Pastor, to guide the congregation on an 18-24 month journey to call a new one.

Webster, 35, is a Eugene native and 1999 graduate of Sheldon High School. His own journey to this current position, just 20 miles away from his hometown, was far from direct. Along the way served churches in five denominations and discovered he had a gift for helping a church heal after dealing with a major change in their congregation.

"I first felt a call into ministry while in high school and attending the non-denominational Emerald Bible Fellowship," he recalled. "I asked the youth pastor how I would know if God is calling me into the ministry. He said try other things first- and so I did. My undergraduate years in college were my sojourn to find where the Lord really wanted me to be."

After high school graduation he attended a culinary arts school in Portland and determined that was not his calling. He returned to Eugene and attended Lane Community College and became interested in law enforcement. He transferred to Western Oregon University to pursue

that dream before realizing that wasn't the direction God wanted him to go.

In the winter of 2001, he had a lifechanging experience at a Missions Conference at a Southern Baptist Seminary in California and finally accepted his call into the ministry. After spending a year at the Oklahoma Baptist University, in 2002, he came home to Oregon and completed his undergraduate studies at Eugene Bible College, earning a degree in Pastoral Ministry with emphasis in Bible and Christian Counseling. He then completed a Masters of Arts in Theology at Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena, Calif. in 2007.

After his second degree, he returned to Eugene to accept a six-month position as the interim youth pastor at Valley Covenant Church and then at Northwood Christian Church in Springfield. His next position was senior pastor at the First Baptist Church in Yreka, Calif. When that church closed, he served two Methodist Churches in Northern California. He and his family welcomed the opportunity to return to Oregon to accept his current interim assignment at Cottage Grove's First Baptist Church.

In the American Baptist churches, whenever a longtime pastor leaves or retires, it's an opportunity for the congregation to re-evaluate its needs and identify its strengths and weaknesses to aid in calling their next pastor. Although
