## Air Quality:

With the cancellation of their game last Tuesday, this was the third time the boys soccer team has had a game or jamboree cancelled this season. Head coach Vern Stewart noted that in all his time coaching he had never had one game cancelled for smoke let alone three different contests. Stewart also said that the poor air quality has limited practices as well especially since five of his players have asthma.
