## Sky-Em Changes

Cottage Grove will have new competition in league next season

Cottage Grove High School will be facing some new opponents in Sky-Em league-play starting next fall.

Last week, the OSAA finalized plans that will change the structure of the league. Sisters, Sutherlin and Sweet Home will all be leaving the Sky-Em while Siuslaw, Marshfield and Marist, previously 5A, will be joining the league.

"It's going to be fun. I'm looking forward to having Marshfield in the league because that's where I grew up and I'm looking forward to having Marist in the league because I want our kids to compete against the best kids out there," said CGHS Athletic Director Gary Roberts. "It's going to be a big challenge for us but I'm excited."

The farthest Cottage Grove will now travel for league games will be 94 miles to Marshfield which is down from the previous farthest distance to Sisters of 125 miles. Aside from that, the average travel distance to each school in the district is down from 61 miles to 56.

"From a travel standpoint it worked out pretty well for us and I think from a competition standpoint it worked out pretty well for us. I think overall I'm pleased," said Roberts.

On the competition side, the Lions will be facing tough bat-

Football, where the Lions are currently undefeated and ranked number one in 4A, will become a bigger challenge in league play next season. Marshfield is the only other team in 4A that is currently undefeated in football and Marist is currently ranked 10th at the 5A level.

Additionally, the Lions do not have the best track record with the Pirates and Spartans. Between 2006-2015 Cottage Grove played Marist and Marshfield six times in football and lost all six games. On average the Lions scored 12 points and gave up 40 points in those games.

The Lions will have their hands full in other sports as well. Marist's volleyball, boys and girls soccer teams and boys and girls cross-country teams all fall between being ranked third and 14th at the 5A level this season. Last season Marist's girls basketball team finished fourth in state and their softball team won the state title.

For Marshfield, their volleyball team is currently ranked 8th in the state. Additionally, last year the Pirates girls basketball team finished ranked 3rd in state, the boys track team won state and the girls track team took 6th.

And while Siuslaw is ranked 22nd in volleyball, 37th in football (and they don't have a boys or girls soccer team) and their basketball, baseball and softball teams were in the same area of the rankings, both cross-country teams are currently ranked in the top five of the state and both their track and field teams did better than the Lions last season.

Cottage Grove football beats Sutherlin and continues winning ways

Undefeated.

For the second year in a row, the Cottage Grove football team completed the regular season without a loss and claimed the Sky-Em League title.

The Lions, who won back-to-back titles for the first time in program history, now enter the playoffs with the number one seed as they seek redemption after losing in the championship game last season.

"Really happy for the kids; for the seniors," said head coach Gary Roberts. "Kids did a good job. We were able to cut down the turnovers this week and I was really proud of our kids. I'm happy for our kids, our coaches and just the community and the high school."

On Friday night, it was more of what it has been all season for the Lions as they defeated Sutherlin 63-21. The Lions, who scored more points than any other team in 4A this season, won their sixth game of the year by over 30 points.

The first half saw seven Cottage Grove touchdowns on their first seven possessions. The lethal wide receiver combination of Jacob Woods and Hayden Glenn was again active this game. While the pair only played in the first half, it was more than enough time for them to find success.

Glenn had four receptions for 100 yards and two touchdowns, including a 55 yard score on a double move down the right side that broke him wide open

for the easy score. Not to be outdone, Woods had four receptions, three of which were touchdown receptions of 33, 35 and 36 yards. He also had three rushes for 65 yards.

Quarterback Dylan Graves ended the game with the absurdly efficient stat line of 8-for-10 with 198 yards passing and five touchdowns. The Lions were also active on the ground as Juice Claflin and Chad Bottorff each rushed for a touchdown.

"There's always things you can do better," said head coach Gary Roberts on the first half success. "Always things you can do better, but the kids played hard and they were fired up for senior night and they did a good job."

Up 49-0 at the half, the Lions second-string unit took up where the starters left off. With the running clock moving, the DeJean Alonzo lead of-

fense marched down the field and a Logan Nelson nine-yard rush put Cottage Grove up 56-0.

Sutherlin then found the end zone once before the quarter ended, the start of the fourth and with just seconds left on the clock. David Cox also added a 12 yard rush for a touchdown.

While Cottage Grove secured the win, the postseason awaits them and it is clear that their goal is to bring home the title that eluded them last season.

"The first part is done and now everybody is 0-0 and the second part begins," said Roberts. "We got a week off and in that we will focus on Cottage Grove. We will focus on getting better at the little things."

The Lions will have a bye week this week and will host a round of 16 game on either Friday Nov. 3 or Saturday Nov. 4.
