Teens charged in Creswell lumber mill fire

Three teenagers are in custody after engaging in a mini crime spree that included allegedly starting at least three fires and several minor thefts in the Creswell area.

Sergeant Carrie Carver of the Lane County Sheriff's Office reported that three male juveniles--two 13-year-olds and one 16-yearold--were in custody and facing charges of arson in the first degree, arson in the second degree, criminal mischief in the first degree, reckless burning and burglary in the first and second degree.

A fire broke out at a lumber mill owned by Fore Lumber LLC on Butte Rd. on October 22. The fire caused thousands in damages and a nearby residence was evacuated while crews battled the blaze. A smaller fire was apparently set at the same mill on October 8 which is also being attributed to the teens. Prior to the October 8 mill fire, the teens allegedly started a suspicious fire at Holt Park on October 20 and an additional fire at Creswell Middle School on October 20.

The 16-year-old is also being investigated in connection to a vacant house fire started on September 28. According to the sheriff's office, all three juveniles had cooperat-

ed with the investigation and are currently being housed at the Lane County Juvenile Justice Center. Due to their ages, the names of the teenagers are not currently being released.

<u>Tips for Leaf Placement in Street</u>

✓ Only piles of loose leaves will be picked up ✓ Pile leaves on the street surface near the gutter, keeping gutter

The City of Cottage Grove Public Works Department will be conducting its annual Leaf Pickup during the following weeks: November 13th -17th • December 4th - 8th • December 18th-22nd

and catch basins free of leaves so storm water is not obstructed ✓ On streets without curbs and gutter, pile the leaves near the street surface away from ditches

✓ Stack the leaves so that they don't block bike and traffic lanes

✓ Leaves should be piled in rows so they do not block the flow of water along the curb and do not encroach on the traffic lane

✓Do <u>not</u> place leaves in the streets where curbside parking does not exist. You may bring those leaves to the designated area outside the Row River Water Treatment Plant at 3300 Row River Road


✓ Do **not** place your leaves in plastic bags

✓ Branches will **not** be picked up

✓ Shrub prunings and blackberry vines will **not** be picked up

✓ Do <u>not</u> include rocks, metal or other debris in your leaf pile

✓ Lawn clippings will **not** be picked up
