Hasbro's action figure link includes 3.75-inch figures of all major and minor characters from "The Last Jedi," along with matching vehicles. What sets these action figures apart is the Force Link technology, which enables playback of sound effects and phrases from the movie. The Force Link BB-8 mega playset (pictured, \$199.99) opens to features six play areas with special sound effects to recreate movie scenes, features Supreme Leader Snoke and Elite Praetorian Guard action figures, and includes a Force Link wristband.
