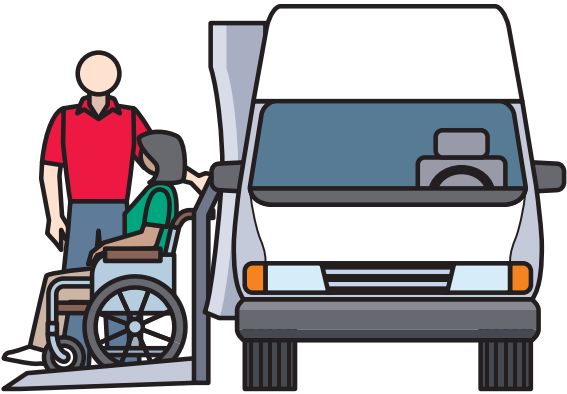

Interim chief chosen for PeaceHealth

PeaceHealth has named an interim chief executive for the Oregon network. Joe Mark will join the organization on April 23, 2018. "Joe is a seasoned healthcare executive, with 35 years of integrated leadership experience as a hospital chief executive officer, chief operating officer and vice president in addition to 10 years of strategy and operations improvement consulting," said Richard DeCarlo, PeaceHealth executive vice president, chief operating officer. "We are looking for-

ward to welcoming Joe to Oregon and know his expertise and proven leadership experience will be of great value to the network during this executive transition." Currently, Mark is a director with WolfCreek Partners Group, a firm that focuses on growing leaders and building teams that are focused on vision-directed outcomes at a time when industries including healthcare are becoming increasingly complex. Prior to his time with WolfCreek, Mark served as in-

terim senior vice president and area manager for two Kaiser Foundation Hospitals in California, where he focused his efforts on key operational goals to enhance quality outcomes among other performance markers. Mark will serve in this interim role while PeaceHealth conducts a national search for a permanent chief executive for Oregon. Rand O'Leary, outgoing chief executive for PeaceHealth Oregon, is leaving the organization on April 20.

The Bureau of Land Management plans to repair portions of the Row River Trail in Cottage Grove beginning this summer.

Trains no longer travel the abandoned Oregon Pacific and Eastern Railroad line in Cottage Grove and soon, bicyclists won't either. The Bureau of Land Management announced last week that it planned to close the Row River Trail—a 13.5-mile long path that runs along the defunct railway—in order to make repairs that would include sealing cracks and repaving portions of the trail. The closure would run from July through November of this year. According to the BLM, the work would begin in July and start at mile 8.3, running through mile 10.1. "It will affect people who use the trail," said Cottage Grove Public Works and Development Director Faye Stewart. "They'll either have to turn around at that point and head back or the BLM may put in a detour around that." The BLM estimated the total cost of repairs, which includes replacing drain pipes, would be approximately \$700,000. The agency has already set aside \$300,000 for the project. The Row River Trail is a popular attraction for residents. Mayor Jeff Gowing held his first "Bike Ride with the Mayor" event last year and has plans to continue the event this year. According to Stewart, city events may be affected by the closure but he was uncertain of which events would fall within the July-November timespan. Cottage Grove City Manager Richard Meyers was unavailable as of press time.

Man arrested after stand-off



The search for Randal Jernigan-Wynn, 58, has ended after he was arrested in Cottage Grove on March 22. Jernigan-Wynn had been the focus of a Feb. 24 stand-off

in Creswell that saw the Lane County Sheriff's Office block off roads and utilize flash bangs to attempt to capture Jernigan-Wynn who has previously been charged with illegal possession of heroin and methamphetamine. According to a press release concerning the Feb., 24 incident, Jernigan-Wynn was not at the residence but evidence indicated he had been in the area prior to the arrival of law enforcement. Jernigan-Wynn was apprehended on E. Main St. in Cottage Grove at approximately 1:30 a.m. by Cottage Grove law enforcement which was assisted by the Bureau of Alcohol and Firearms, the Marshal Service and Lane County Sheriff's Office.

He's being charged with three counts of unlawful possession of methamphetamine, three counts of unlawfull delivery of methamphetamine, two counts of unlawful delivery of heroin and six counts of felony in possession of a firearm.
