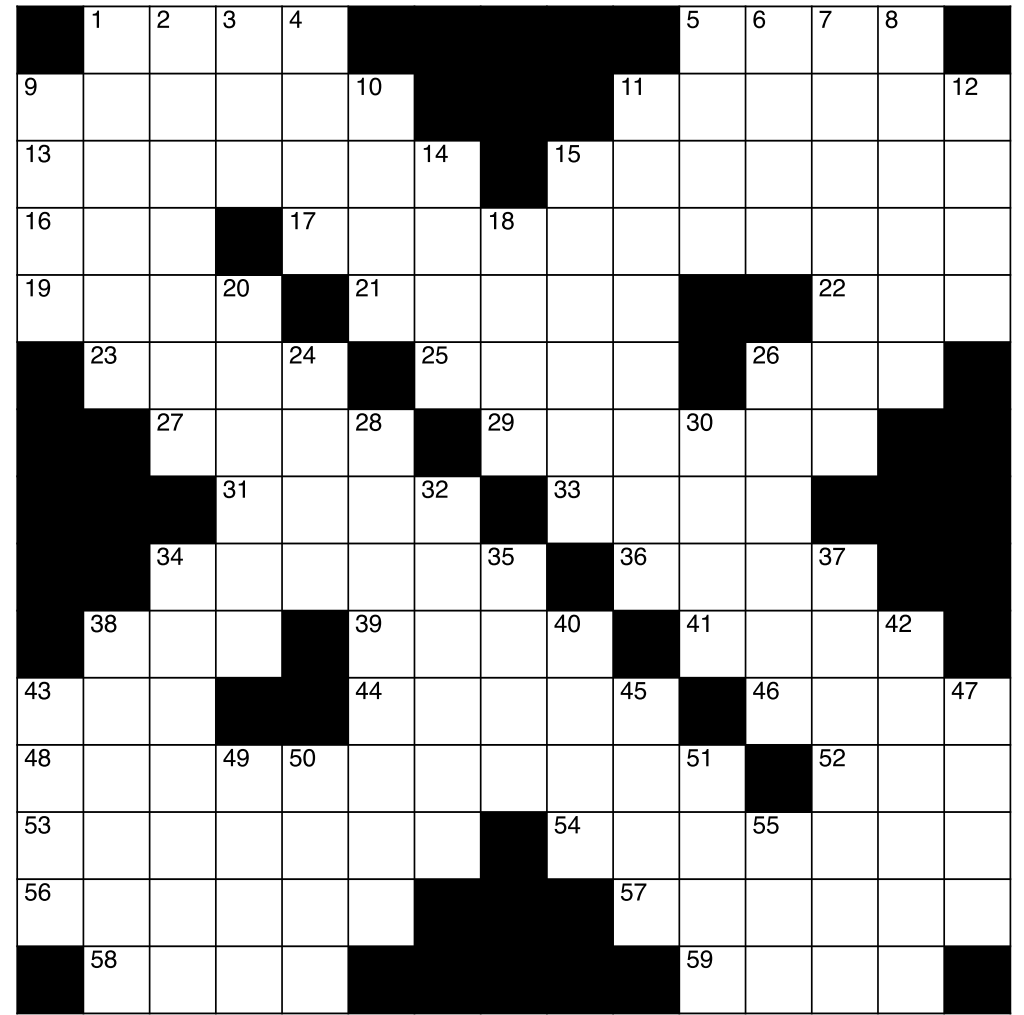

Less than 10% of the U.S. population currently visits a government web site daily.** You should not have to know where, when, and how to look, or what to look for, in order to be informed. It is the government's responsibility to deliver notice to the public.
