

NEWS FROM AROUND THE STATE =

- The teenage boy who started the fire in the Columbia River Gorge last summer has been ordered to pay damages in the amount of \$36 million. The teen, unnamed due to his age, threw a firecracker from a hiking trail, igniting a wildfire that burned for more than two months and torched more than 48,000 acres. The boy pled guilty to eight counts of reckless burning and two counts of depositing burning material on forest land. He also pled guilty to criminal mischief and was ordered to complete nearly 2,000 hours of community service and serve five years of probation.
- 21-year-old Dylan Baker Pietrs was found dead at Lake Shasta last weekend. His body was found in his tent and officials said it was unclear if alcohol played a part in his death. The University of Oregon drew criticism for a statement it released about the incident in which it cited students' "history of demonstrating poor life choices during visits to Shasta Lake."
- A wrong-way driver on Interstate-5 killed three teenagers on Sunday, May 20. The girls, who were traveling near

in June.

- The CDC reported earlier this week that Oregon is one of the three new states to report a case of E. coli linked to the outbreak caused by lettuce around the nation.
- A 4.6-magnitude earthquake struck 100 miles east of Bandon on Sunday morning. It's the fourth earthquake to be recorded for Oregon since April 20.


