The Trojans have scored the second most runs in the state at the 2A/1A level this season and have given up the least number of runs - including 10 shutouts. This was the second playoff game in a row for Kennedy that they have won 13-0 in five innings.

"I know the girls were just eager to play just to say you know a little redemption," said Kennedy

head coach Walt Simmons. "It's too bad that Nicki wasn't there. I think that it was pretty tight last year (when we played)... When we heard she was out it changed the complexion a little bit because she's pretty good and we struggled (against her)."

In addition to the Trojans being a top-tier team, the Warriors were not helping themselves defensively as poor decisions and errors led to runs. With one out, a routine double play turned into a single out that spurred a two-out rally instead of a scoreless inning; balls were dropped; throws sailed over their intended targets.

"We got to the point where we were doing real good holding them and

then when (Kennedy) started really hitting the ball we panicked. The girls all of a sudden saw their season ending," said Rice. "We had a lot of missed played balls where the girl was thinking, 'Ok, I'm going to throw it to first before she catches the ball.' So I kept telling them, catch the ball first, then make that play."

The Trojans were relentless with a pair of runs in the first, two in the third and eight in the fourth to seal the game and North Douglas' season.

"I think we started out really good but all of a sudden we lost that. When they started hitting we kind of lost our confidence, started to panic. And that was pretty much all she wrote," said Rice.
