The passage above, from an article written decades ago, describes a tree on the Row River Trail that served as the main character in local folklore and tradition. On Sunday, June 17, a windstorm knocked the tree down, ending a local legend. The Wedding Tree served as a landmark and the story goes that Native Americans split the tree prior to their marriage and believed that if the tree survived the damage, their marriage would last the duration of their lives.
