Remember to observe fireworks safety restrictions June 23 marked the opening of the season

for fireworks sales in Oregon. Legal fireworks can be purchased only from Oregon permitted fireworks retailers and stands.

Oregon law prohibits possession, use or sale of any firework that fly into the air, explode or travel more than 12 feet horizontally on the ground, without a permit issued by the OSFM.

Fireworks commonly called bottle rockets, Roman candles and firecrackers are illegal in Oregon without a permit.


All fireworks are prohibited on all Oregon beaches, in state parks and campgrounds and on all federal public lands.

Officials can seize illegal fireworks and charge offenders with a class B misdemeanor which could result in a fine of up to \$2,500 per violation and a civil penalty of up to \$500.
