The permits are for personal use only and cost \$5 per tree. There's a limit of five tree permits per household. Permits may be used only on those lands open to Christmas tree harvesting on the Umpqua National Forest. Maps identifying these areas will be provided at the time of permit purchase.

As part of the ongoing national initiative Every Kid in a Park, fourth graders who get their free pass to access thousands of fee sites across the country may also bring that pass into their lo-cal Forest Service office and receive one Christmas tree permit, free of charge.
