cluded comments from current Latham staff members and parents about the future of the school.

"The following report presents all of the relevant information and data necessary to help make an informed decision on the future of Latham Elementary School," read the introduction of the report. "The report does not give recommendations or make any sort of conclusions. Rather it presents facts, data and feedback from staff and parents that can serve as a guide and reference in making a decision."

The final decision regarding Latham's future is still planned for the January board meeting with additional discussion taking place at a special session meeting on December 17. At the December 17 meeting, the board will be discussing the contents of the report and responding from questions from Latham parents.

"Today was all about presenting the data, best we could. Getting questions in front of the board. Get more information, come back, hopefully get more input - we have a lot of input from the Latham community but more from them," said Sullivan. "Again, this is going to be a hard decision whatever (the board does). So, I want to make sure they really have some time to think through it and be thoughtful."

On Monday, the board members asked questions as the information was presented to them but gave no real indication on their leanings of how they would vote when the time

"I came away feeling much more confident about the kind of decision we would like to make. We have the facts that, whichever way we choose to go, we know how to get there," said board chair Alan Baas.

Baas also noted that the addition of the comments from the Latham community gave a fresh perspective on the de-

"It gave me much more solid – I felt like I was walking in all your moccasins because I got so many hits on how your experience in the school and how it's important to you," said

After the meeting, Sullivan noted he was pleased with how this document displayed the realities of Latham and how it sets up the board for their de-

"Anytime you close a school there's the emotional piece the value that the community puts in the school. There is the budget piece. There's all sorts of things and it's never real clear or an easy decision," he said. "I've been through a number of building closures in Eugene and others.
