Warriors cruise to pair of wins at Invitational

North Douglas boys roll during Winter Invitational

The North Douglas boys had a simple plan on the first night of their Winter Invitational night: run, run and run some more.

Friday against a Lowell team that features height, and not speed, the goal was to win the game with their fast break which they were able to do as they raced their way to a 56-33

victory. It was never in doubt as the team used their speed to go up 15-0 early in the first quarter.

"We talked about all week in practice we're going to push the ball on them and make them run with us because we're a fast team. That's what our plan was, that's what we did and it worked out well," said North Douglas head coach Tyler Vancil. "Let's try to beat them down the floor so we can score layups when they're not in there. Because as you can see, the big guy, he's good at blocking shots. He's got long arms and does a good job at blocking the ball."

The fast break was often led by the Cal Parks who would either score - he had six points on the quarter - or find Jake Gerrard down court. Ger-

rard nine of his 12 points in the first quarter.

"That's just kind of what (Parks) does," said Vancil. "He's quicker than most guys on the court all the time. So he's trying to get up the court because if he's got one guy to beat, he's probably going to beat him." Parks finished with a game-high 17 points.

After a nearly even second quarter of play, the Warriors leaned on their starters to close out the game in the third quarter and the start of the fourth quarter. Tanner Parks added nine points for North Douglas.

"They know how to run the floor and to get it up into the plays we're running and they play well together. Especially those first five, they play really well together. That's basically it. They know the offense better so they kind of flow together

better," said Vancil.

While the starting group sealed the deal, it opened up minutes for the end of the bench including JV players who swing up to varsity. The JV team has not had any games this season.

"Those guys don't have a lot of minutes on the floor... One of them doesn't even play basketball but just wanted to come out his senior year and he does a good job," said Vancil. "But

they got to know every game be ready to go because we don't have a lot of guys and if we got into foul trouble and need to throw somebody in there we're going to throw them in there."

On Saturday North Douglas defeated Mapleton 80-45. The Warriors outscored the Sailors 51-20 in the second half. Gerrard led the team with 28 points while Koldan Frieze had 17 and Cal Parks 10.

going to have a problem with this. But we started, for some reason, standing around, I don't know why," said Parker. "I think they panicked a little bit. I don't know, maybe we

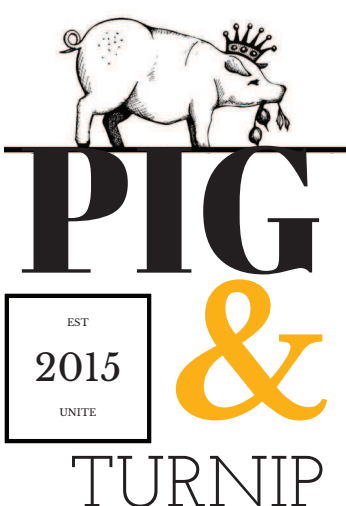
