

Two men arrested for poaching deer in Drain

On Dec. 6, an Oregon State Police Fish and Wildlife Trooper from the Roseburg Area Command responded to the report of a poaching and trespassing incident that occurred on Dec. 5 in the Drain area.

The investigation revealed that a large black tail buck deer was shot within feet of a residence in Drain.

The event was captured on the home security system. With assistance from the Douglas County Sheriff's Office, subjects of interest were identified.

On Dec. 14, troopers and sheriff's deputies contacted the subjects of interest at their residence. The antlers and head for a 4X3 black tail deer were recovered. The meat that was recovered from a butcher shop will be donated to a charity.

Trent M. Tinnes, 25, and Travis D. Tinnes, 21, both of Drain, were lodged at the Douglas County jail on charges of unlawfully taking of a buck deer

with a prohibited method, weapon and houses; hunting while in violation of criminal trespass, criminal trespass with a firearm and recklessly endangering another person.

Or the TIP program also offers cash rewards for information leading to an arrest or issuance of a citation for the unlawful take/possession or waste of

Bighorn Sheep, Rocky Mountain Goat, Moose, Elk, Deer, Antelope, Bear, Cougar, Wolf, Upland Birds, Waterfowl, and Furbearers.

Cash rewards can also be awarded for the unlawful take of Game Fish and Shellfish and for Habitat Destruction.

- Cash rewards:
- \$1,000 Bighorn Sheep, Rocky Mountain Goat and Moose
 - \$500 Elk, Deer and Antelope
 - \$300 Bear, Cougar and Wolf
 - \$300 Habitat Destruction
 - \$100 Upland Birds and Waterfowl
 - \$100 Furbearers
 - \$100 Game Fish and Shellfish

legislature greenlighted accessory dwellings. Because CVC purchased the land on E. Madison with a house already on the property, the first tiny home could be considered an accessory dwelling.

Under the terms of the initial Meyer Memorial Trust grant that purchased the land, the project was set to be completed by the end of summer.

However, the group secured extensions and, as

of October, had fundraised approximately half of the estimated \$1.2 million the project is expected to cost.

According to Kelsh, the next step is to build a stem wall foundation before proceeding with the remainder of the project.

The development is not currently taking applications from potential renters but CVC has started exploring how to construct a neighborhood review board to help oversee the process of choosing residents.
