Prior to his death, Lurch had quick-claimed the property to his daughter, Lilly, but she didn't hang onto it very long. Somewhere between 1922 and 1926, the house was moved from its location on Main Street to where it sits now, next to the Red Oak tree on Adams Street. A developer named Earl Hill was in possession of the property by 1936 and, in 1946, 412 Adams was sold to and held by a family for more than 50 years.

Cora Dailey and the Dailey family held the home until 2014, when it was sold to a member of The Sentinel's previous sales staff — a man who used to sit at the desk Santana currently occupies.

"There's a lot of connections between The Sentinel and the house," he said. "There were so many things — signs that led us to the house."

By the time Santana entered the house in 2018, it was a mess. The electrical system wasn't up to code, the exterior needed a lot of work and some of the rooms had been left half renovated.

"I had started pulling down the cobwebs and the wallpaper, but the more I thought about the house and the history, I started wondering if I should be taking all of these things down," he said.

So, Santana embarked on a journey to uncover the history of his new home with the help of the local historical society.

Now, Santana is working with the historical society to give a talk later this year on the property's history and, with the exception of the exterior, the interior of the house is livable again and mirrors the house's history.

"We changed some things," Santana said. "But except for a few fixtures and some drywall in the entry, it's back to livable." The family doesn't mind the renovation process. Before moving from California, they owned an old Victorian house in a popular area of the state that used to be home to writer Jack Kerouac. When they decided to leave the area, one place topped their list: Paradise, Calif.

"Yeah," Santana said, "We almost moved to Paradise."

The city became a ghost town after a wildfire spread through the community, decimating houses, leaving entire blocks

able to take legal action if those terms were not met by their employer.

In 2017, the state legislature passed the Oregon Equal Pay Act — several key components of the law went into effect at the start of this month. Employees can file against their employers for unpaid wages and should a difference in pay exist between employees, the only acceptable reasons include merit, education, experience and quality of work.

The law is intended to add additional protections to prevent wage disparities on the basis of gender, race, sexual orientation, veteran status, marital status, age or disability. The law also prohibits employers from hiring individuals based on their salary history.

#### **Domestic violence laws:**

Strangulation during the course of a domestic violence incident is now a felony in the state of Oregon. The act was previously considered a misdemeanor.

The "boyfriend loophole" is now closed. Individuals convicted of domestic abuse are barred from owning a firearm under House Bill 4145.

Previously, abusers who were not married to their victim and did not share children with them could maintain their gun ownership leaving leeway for those who were simply dating the person they were convicted of abusing to own a firearm.

#### **Childcare laws:**

Foster kids in the state can now receive tuition waivers for community college and universities.

As of Jan. 1, students will no longer have to complete 30 hours of community service to qualify if they've spent time in the state's foster care system.

House Bill 4067 expands the definition of special education allowing children with developmental disabilities under the age of 10 to receive free services within the public education system.

#### Hit and run:

In 2013, sisters Abigail Robinson and Anna Dieter-Eckert were killed when a neighbor hit them with her vehicle while they were playing in a pile of leaves near the street. The neighbor felt what she described as a "bump" but continued driving, not imagining she had hit two children.


