Councilor Greg Ervin, who was also a part of the process said his vote was not swayed by the comments despite agreeing with Lamb-Solsbee that they were "inappropriate." The issue was originally raised when councilor Fleck inquired as to the decision after former councilor Garland Burback was not appointed to the commission despite having years of experience. Fleck later clarified that he was not questioning Boone, Ervin or the committee's decision, but had been curious as to the thought process behind it.

Mayor Jeff Gowing noted that the board had often made decisions based on the interview.
