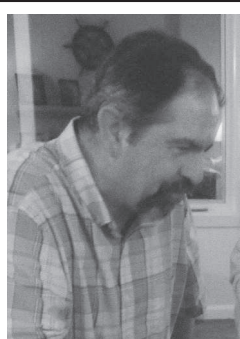
Jan. 20
