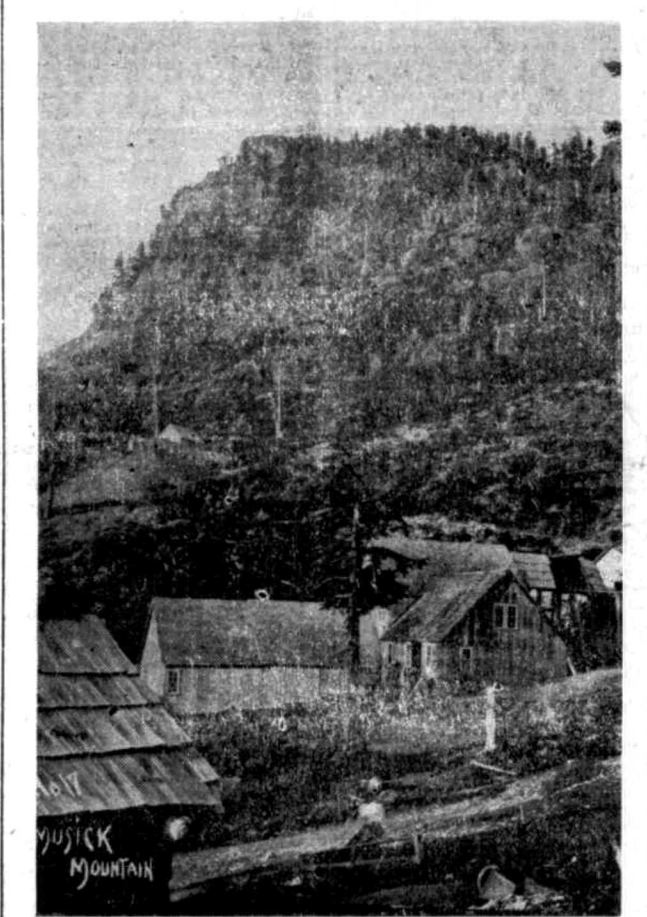

RUSSIANS ARE ALARMED

Peasantry On the Verge of a Revolution.

PORT ARTHUR TAKEN

Such a Rumor Circulated But Lacks Confirmation—Shooting at Drain

Berlin, March 2.—Russia is on the verge of a revolution. Minister of the Interior Plehve regards the peasantry as in a most dangerous condition. The government has proclaimed a minor state of siege which is a mild form of martial law, in fifty-three out of seventy-one provinces in European Russia.

Shooting at Drain.

Cannon has been bound over in the sum of \$500 bonds, which he furnished.
