Sheriff's office offers cold weather safety tips

- As temperatures drop this winter, the Red Cross shares these 10 steps to help you stay safe during cold weather.
1. Layer up! Wear layers of lightweight clothing to stay warm. Gloves and a hat will help prevent losing your body heat.
 2. Don't forget your furry friends. Bring pets indoors. If they can't come inside, make sure they have enough shelter to keep them warm and that they can get to unfrozen water.
 3. Remember the three-foot rule. If you are using a space heater, place it on a level, hard surface and keep anything flammable at least three feet away – things such as paper, clothing, bedding, curtains or rugs.
 4. Supervision Required – Turn off space heaters and make sure fireplace embers are out before leaving the room or going to bed.
 5. Don't catch fire! If you are using a fireplace, use a glass or metal fire screen large enough to catch sparks

- and rolling logs.
6. Protect your pipes. Run water, even at a trickle, to help prevent your pipes from freezing. Open the kitchen and bath-room cabinet doors to allow warmer air to circulate around the plumbing. Be sure to move any harmful cleaners and household chemicals out of the reach of children. Keep garage doors closed if there are water lines in the garage.
 7. Better safe than sorry. Keep the thermostat at the same temperature day and night. Your heating bill may be a little higher, but you could avoid a more-costly repair job if your pipes freeze and burst.
 8. The kitchen is for cooking. Never use a stove or oven to heat your home.
 9. Use generators outside. Never operate a generator inside the home, including in the basement or garage.
 10. Knowledge is power. Don't hook a generator up to the home's wiring. The safest thing to do is to connect the equipment you want to power

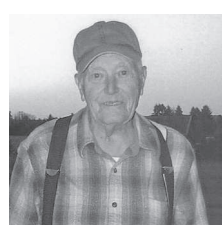
Albert married Peggy Westbrook on July 2, 1979 in Reno, NV and later divorced.

Bob was a kind and humble man of few words, always willing to help those in need. He came home safely after serving as an Air Force Captain in WWII. Before Bob and his two brothers were off to serve in the war, his mother Marion Wright Woolcott, made Bible covers for them cut out of the wool coat that saved her life as a Titanic survivor. She believed that it was divine intervention that all three of her sons returned home safely after serving as officers in WWII. That coat is now on display at the National Geographic Museum.
