The game marked the end of North Douglas’ non-league schedule (until a non-league double-header with Bandon on April 20) that saw the Warriors go 4-1 including three shutouts.

“Regardless of who the opponents are – I’m talking about pitching right now – our control has been good. We’ve scored in a lot of differ-

ent ways,” said Davis. “I was just talking with the coaches, baseball season is a sprint. It is a very short season. And so how fast and how much we can improve in this spring to the middle of May. We’re only talking about six weeks now, five or six weeks and we’re done.”

Now the focus turns to Special District 4 that includes second-ranked Umpqua Valley Christian. With no district playoff this year and the top three teams of the seven-team league getting automatic bids to the

playoffs, the Warriors are looking to stay competitive in the upcoming week-long series with each team.

“Got to win those series, got to get two out of three. UVC is very good, they’re another team in this conversation for a state title. Glide has come down, they’re going to be good. Riddle we play next week, supposedly has one of the better pitchers in our league,” said Davis naming off some of the league competition. “Douglas County has always been a good baseball area.”
