PeaceHealth offering free peripheral artery disease screenings

During the month of April, PeaceHealth Sacred Heart Medical Center at RiverBend is offering free, pre-scheduled screenings for peripheral artery disease, a common and potentially dangerous circulatory problem in which narrowed or clogged arteries reduce blood flow to the limbs.

According to the Centers for Disease Control, approximately 10 million Americans suffer from peripheral artery disease, which places them at an in-

creased risk of heart attack and stroke.

The 15-minute screenings will be held at the Oregon Heart & Vascular Institute at RiverBend, 3333 RiverBend Dr. in Springfield. They include an ankle-brachial index measure (ABI) — a comparison of the blood pressure at the ankle and in the upper arm. Lower blood pressure at the ankle can indicate possible blocked arteries.

To be eligible for the free screening, you must be over 50 with one or more of the following conditions:

- Current or recent smoker
- Diabetic
- Family history of abdominal aortic aneurysm
- Experiencing pain or

numbness in legs, especially when walking

• Not currently under the care of a vascular physician

The most common symptoms of PAD are leg pain, fatigue or numbness when walking.

The pain can range from mild to debilitating and can restrict physical activity and even result in loss of a limb.

However, as many as half of those with PAD experience no noticeable symptoms.

LRAPA Board adopts Cleaner Air Oregon rules

LRAPA Board approves administrative changes and directs LRAPA to implement the health-based air toxics program adopted by the Oregon Environmental Quality Commission (EQC) Nov. 15, 2018.

The Board of Directors for Lane Regional Air Protection Agency (LRAPA) voted 7 to 0 on March 14 to approve administrative changes to integrate Cleaner Air Oregon rules with existing LRAPA program rules.

Some of the changes to existing rules amend LRAPA's

part of the Oregon Clean Air Act State Implementation Plan (SIP). Staff is planning to seek EQC review and approval for inclusion into the SIP at the May 2019 EQC meeting.

For a variety of reasons including scope, detail, public input and technical expertise that went into the creation of the Cleaner Air Oregon program, LRAPA will implement Division 245Cleaner Air Oregon by reference without any changes.

"The changes adopted by the Board are administrative

changes to add definitions, enforcement clarifications, and mainly a fee table that will apply to Lane County's Cleaner Air Oregon sources," said Jo Niehaus, LRAPA's Public Affairs Manager.

In addition to closing gaps in existing air quality rules, Cleaner Air Oregon rules will provide the public greater access to air toxics emissions data and create more certainty for regulated facilities in addressing community health concerns.

LRAPA will implement the program next by working on

the ranking to prioritize the call-in for existing sources. "We are currently planning to publish the groups in the first two existing source tiers for call-in by sometime in early summer of this year," said Max Hueftle, LRAPA's lead staff person for the rules.

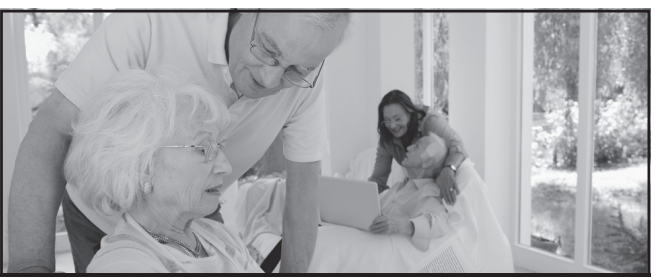

Driving tips during dangerous saturation conditions

Heavy or extended rain can create dangerous driving conditions including reduced visibility, reduced traction between tires and the road, and less predictable car handling.

Before heading out, visit TripCheck.com to check your route, and give yourself more time to get where you are going. Also remember to:

- Slow down, especially through high water. Driving through several inches of water at high speed can cause you to lose control of

the car.

• Be aware of the potential for hydroplaning, when your tires encounter more water than they can scatter. Your tire loses traction with the road and if this occurs, ease off the gas, gently apply the brakes and steer straight ahead.

- Keep your distance; you may need more time to slow down.
- Turn on your headlights to improve visibility.
- Disengage your cruise control.

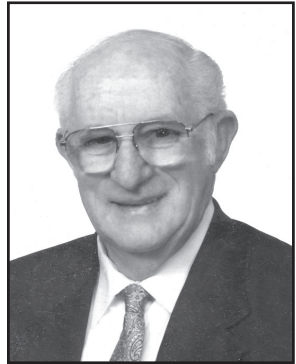
• Check your brakes. After driving through a puddle, check that brakes are working properly by tapping them gently a few times.
