patched to counsel a five-year-old about violence toward his two-year-old brother.

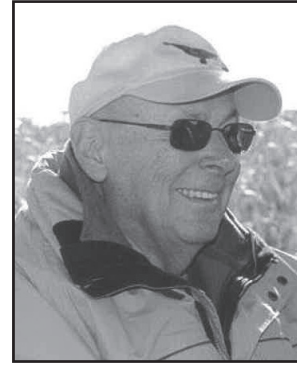
April 17
