## Phone service outage impacting 9-1-1 service in rural areas

Another telephone service outage is this time affecting customers in the Yoncalla, Drain, Elkton, Scottsburg and Ash Valley areas. The outage may prevent residents in those areas from dialing 9-1-1 from their landline telephones. The telephone service providers affected by the outage, CenturyLink and Cascade Utilities, are currently investigating the cause of the outage. There is no estimated time of re-

pair.

Residents who are affected may be able to dial 9-1-1 from a cellular device in the event of an emergency. The Drain, Elkton and Scottsburg fire departments are also staffed with personnel while the issue is being resolved.
