Get '2 Weeks Ready' during National Preparedness Month

September is National Preparedness Month and Oregon's Office of Emergency Management urges individuals, families, businesses and local organizations to take time during this timeframe — and throughout the year — to be "2 Weeks Ready."

For many years, a 72-hour preparedness kit was the standard for disaster planning. This is a good start, and helpful in the event of short-term power outages or temporary evacuation.

But as OEM Director Andrew Phelps points

may need to take care of themselves until formal response resources can reach them," says Phelps.

There is no one correct way to put together two weeks' worth of supplies since everyone has individual dietary and medical needs. If your family includes children, seniors or pets, you will have additional needs.
