Lance Corporal, USMC June 1962 to November 1963. Camp Pendleton, Cal. Sworn into USMC alongside her brother.



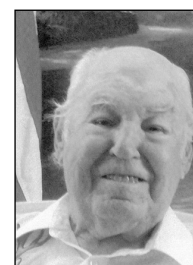

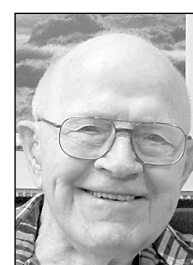
