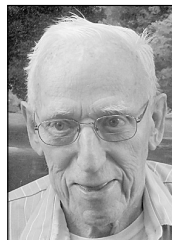

1st Lieutenant, Army Nurse, U.S. Army, 1945-47. New Orleans, Ft. Hood, Texas.



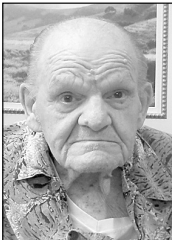
Marvel McConnell

First Class Seaman, US Coast Guard. WWII. Communications.



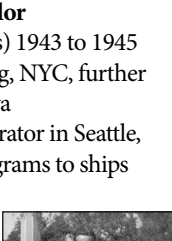
Howard Gilman

Navy and Naval Reserves, 1st Class YN1. 1943-53, Korea USS Grady

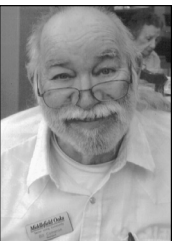

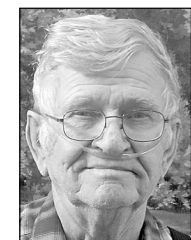

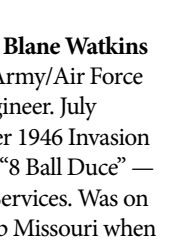

National Guard in Cottage Grove. 5 years E5, 1961-1966 Cottage Grove Armory "It was fun — I was a weekend warrior."

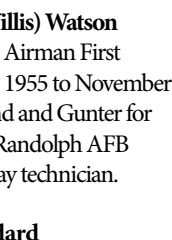

US Air Force, Airman First Class. April 5, 1955 to November 1957. Lackland and Gunter for training and Randolph AFB Hospital X-Ray technician.



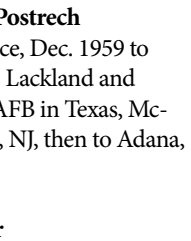

US Army, Europe



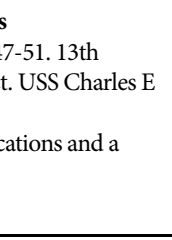
Arnold Earnshaw
