Other Results

Swimming: The Cottage Grove High School swim team began their 2019-20 season with a relay meet that was more fun and games than serious competition.

Last Thursday, Dec. 12 there were no kickboards to be seen as the Lions hosted Marist Catholic, Cascade Christian and Phoenix High Schools for the Cottage Grove Invite at the Warren H. Daugherty Aquatic Center.

As a team, the girls came away victorious with 131 total points to Marist's 94, Cascade's 37 and Phoenix's 54. The boys — swimming with a more shallow bench than usual — nonetheless came in second with 100 points, helped along by sophomore James Kelly's first-place finish in the 200 individual medley (2:22.68). Marist took first on the boys side with 136 points, followed by Phoenix with 69 and Cascade with 62. When combined, Cottage Grove stood atop the podium, edging out Marist by a single point, 231-230, and winning the overall team title in the first truly competitive swimming event at the renovated facility.

In the individual girls' races, senior Emma Burleson set a new personal record in winning the 50 freestyle in a time of 29.66 seconds. Junior MJ Raade matched her teammate by winning the 500 freestyle in 6:01.95 and freshmen Kasidy Poetzl (1:04.72) and Kalee Walter (1:05.14) finished neck-and-neck in first and second in the 100 freestyle. In similar fashion, the Lions' two 200-freestyle relay teams took home both the top spots to seal the team victory. The first-place team (1:56.67) consisted of seniors Mikayla Baird and Nadia Witt, junior MJ Raade and Poetzl. In second (2:01.55) was Burleson along with sophomores Kajsa Merz, Peyton Baird and Evie Smith.

The Lions will look to continue their winning ways at their next meet on Fri., Dec. 20 at the Daugherty Aquatic Center.

Wrestling: The CGHS wrestling team took part in the 2019 Coast Classic at North Bend High School on Fri. and Sat., Dec. 13 and 14. On the boys' side, 32 teams participated with the Lions squad finishing eighteenth. Austin Dempsey (sr.) finished third in the 285-pound weight class while Drew Swenson (sr.) and Walker Humphrey (sr.) both finished sixth at 182 and 195 pounds, respectively.

23 girls' teams were represented at the competition and Cottage Grove took home fourth place overall. Wisper Pilling (fr.) finished sixth in the 170-pound weight class, Lillian Wood (fr.) got fourth at 155, Leslie Chacon (sr.) third at 120, Maryanne Eckstine (jr.) second at 130, Elizabeth Bass (sr.) second at 110 and Raina Herzog (jr.) the lone first-place finisher for the Lions in the 235-pound weight class.

The CGHS wrestling team will next compete on Sat., Dec. 21 at the Liberty Tournament at Liberty High School in Hillsboro, Ore.

gan to fall.

"I'm getting closer with them and starting to realize all the things I need to do and say to pull them back up, which is what we had to do at halftime of this game," Hall said. "Because it wasn't like it was a bad game or anything, but it was just uncomfortably close for me."

Yoncalla outscored the Sailors 33-12 in the second half, including a 30-7 run over the game's final eleven minutes. The Eagles were led by junior Bryan Allen who scored 21 points, including five threes, just one game after his older brother, senior Elijah Allen, led the team to victory against Prospect Charter with 29 points.

"I cannot even tell you how proud I am of this group of gentlemen," Hall said smiling after the game.

The girls continued their hot start to the season in their own win over the Sailors, putting the game out of reach early as they took a 21-2 lead into the second quarter and a 30-6 advantage into half-time.

Yoncalla was led by senior Kaleigh Soto (18 points, four rebounds, one assist, seven steals), sophomore Alison Van Loon (18 points, six rebounds, three steals) and freshman Nichole Noffsinger (11 points, seven rebounds, two assists, three blocks, two steals) who continues to show an intriguing all-around game for such a young player.

Yoncalla began 2018 with three wins and nine losses. They've started 2019 with nine wins and three losses. In last year's start, none of those wins belonged to the girls; this year, five of them do. The boys' team, occasionally marred by frustrations and difficulty coming together as a team in the past, have

exhibited poise and focus in winning four of their first six games.

Before the season began, Eagles' players were aware of the state of the school's basketball program. They wanted to be taken seriously. They wanted to forget past disappointments. One player said they just wanted to stop being known as the "sucky"

team.

The basketball year is still young - and a lot can happen between now and March - but it's a reasonable assumption that, after a torrid run through their early-season games, the Eagles' Skyline League opponents are taking notice of the Yoncalla games on their schedules.

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
