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ODFW offers hunter ed, field days

Now is a great time of year to sign up for a hunter education class or field day, as many classes and field days are currently available.

Students have two options to complete a hunter ed class: A “conventional” class which takes place mostly in a classroom setting in a series of classes (14-16 hours of total class time), or completing a “field day” after taking most of the class via independent study (either online or by workbook). The field day includes handling of firearms and a live fire exercise.

Once students have selected a field day or conventional class, they should login to ODFW’s Licensing System and register for the class from their own account. The cost is \$10. Students who have never logged into their account but have purchased an ODFW document since 2016 should use the Verify/Look up Your Account feature to find their profile in the system. Students who have never had an ODFW license or other product before should choose

Create an Account.

Independent study students need to complete their online course or workbook before going to the field day. See a list of available online courses here-<https://myodfw.com/articles/hunter-education-online-courses> or to request a workbook, email odfw.info@state.or.us

Hunter education is mandatory for all hunters under the age of 18 and recommended for any new hunter. The course covers topics like firearms safety, hunter ethics, wildlife identification, hunt preparation and techniques and outdoor survival. The program certifies about 6,000 new hunters each year.

Classes and field days are taught by ODFW’s network of volunteer hunter education instructors. With most hunting seasons over, these volunteers are back to teaching classes, rather than out in the field hunting.

The next major upcoming general season hunt is spring turkey, which runs April 15-May 31 statewide. There is also a youth-only hunt the weekend before the season, April 11-12, which is open only to youth who have completed a hunter education class.

the mats necessary for a 31-team tournament, and in order for the event to go off without a hitch, the hosts needed all hands on deck.

“It’s making sure that concessions are taken care of, making sure that we have a hospitality room that coaches can enjoy, because I gotta tell you, a wrestling tournament is really deemed good off their hospitality room as well as the wrestling,” Kent said laughing while also making sure to save praise for the people who made the tournament happen.

“With the Mat Club, the concessions wouldn’t have gone off like they did without them. It really is a community sponsored event where everyone is helping. Parents come out, donate, help in the hospitality room, help at the [scorer’s] tables. That’s a goal that we have. Wrestling is one of those sports where it is unique in that it’s a community in and of itself.”

Even CGHS athletic director Matt Myers was quick to deflect praise from himself and his staff. “Wrestling gets all the credit for this one,” Myers said. “The coaches, parents, [CGHS math teacher] Jeff Drum, the wrestlers, they did everything to organize this event.”

While being an achievement of planning and organization, the two-day tournament also functioned as a barometer for the CGHS wrestling team as they get closer and closer to regionals and, eventually, the state tournament. Many of the teams and opponents present at the Invite will be back at regionals when the Lions next wrestle again. In that regard, a number of local competitors have reasons for optimism in the postseason.

In the 152-pound weight class, senior Jacob Dunn won six matches — four by fall — en route to a first-place finish, earning his team 36 points and bringing his season record to 24-1. Fellow senior Drew Swenson also finished atop the podium in the 170-pound class, earning 32 team points. For both athletes, it was their last, true wrestling match at their

home venue before graduating later this year.

“This is kind of a pinnacle tournament before we have regionals for both the boys and girls,” Kent said, “Especially for Jacob and Drew, that was their last time really competing at home ... so it was nice to see them, and the whole team, do as well as they did as a final stamp on our season before we start regionals.”

Junior Raina Herzog continued her torrid season for the girls’ team, winning each of her three matches by fall and earning 26 of Cottage Grove’s 85 total team points for her first-place finish in the 235-pound class. Sophomore Hannah Cook also earned a top-three spot, finishing third in the 135-pound class and scoring 17 team points.

The event wrapped up the Lions’ regular season wrestling schedule and they now look forward to regionals.

“This week, it’s really putting our noses to the grindstone,” Kent said. “The hard part about this point in the season, the mental game is a lot tougher because everyone’s tired and worn out so it’s about

getting them to push through those mental hurdles to give it our more round, one more match, and finish it all the way to the end.”

Girls’ regionals will be held this weekend, Feb. 7 and 8, at Thurston High School and the boys’ regionals will be two weeks later, Feb. 21 and 22, held at Cottage Grove High School. For more wrestling results, see the local scores to the right.

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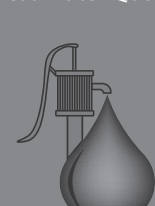
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
