- 4. A Healthier Environment- When you spend your money at local businesses you use less fuel, thereby reducing your carbon footprint on our planet. You'll also get fresher produce from local markets in our
- 5. Lower Taxes- Local businesses generate more tax revenue per sales dollar, which helps keep your taxes lower!
- 6. Save Time and Money It can easily cost over \$8 in gas just to drive to Eugene and back (more if you get less than 20mpg) Your time is worth something too. Even if you only value your time at \$15.00 per hour, that means it will cost you \$23 just to drive there and back.
