State fire marshal extends self-service gas through April 25

The Office of State Fire Marshal is extending a temporary rules change that allows Oregon gas stations to provide self-service on a voluntary basis, in order to address shortages of workers experienced by gas retailers statewide.

The rules change was first announced on March 28 with an expiration date of April 11. This week, State Fire Marshal Jim Walker extended the deadline to April 25.

"We appreciate the patience of all Oregonians and businesses with this temporary suspension of rules, which now allow

for self-service at Oregon gas stations," said Walker. "These changes provide station operators flexibility to manage their operations and help to make refueling safer for both customers and service station attendants, while keeping stations open at a critical time when COVID-19 is impacting gas retailers who serve our many essential workers statewide."

The change allows station attendants to help these customers while avoiding face-to-face, hand-to-hand contact. It also applies physical distancing measures.

Attendants will continue

to sanitize equipment and fuel nozzles and continue to help customers with their refueling as needed.

Self-service is not mandatory but having it as an option allows some gas stations to continue their operations with less staff and allows Oregonians who have to travel to still drive without the concern of not finding gas.

Unattended self-service is permitted when a gas station owner exhausts all staffing options. Stations that do not have an attendant on duty are required to post safety signs for physical distancing and instruc-

tions showing customers how to operate a fuel pump correctly.

This extension of the self-service rules change does not affect areas of the state that are already authorized for self-service refueling under Oregon law.

Statewide initiative announced to support small businesses

The Governor's Jobs and Economy Policy Advisor, Leah Horner, is spearheading the initiative along with the Resource Navigator's lead manager from Business Oregon, Melisa Drugge.

The Resource Navigator will include a hotline and a website containing comprehensive information on key programs for small businesses, available at oregon4biz.com, with access to:

- Small Business As-

sociation programs established by the recently passed federal CARES Act, including: the Paycheck Protection Program, Economic Injury Disaster Loans, and Debt Relief programs

- State of Oregon programs, including the Entrepreneurial Development Loan Fund

- Local government programs, such as the South Central Oregon

Economic Development District Economic Relief Loan Fund for Small Businesses

- More resources will be rapidly added to the Resource Navigator website on an ongoing basis

- A hotline and email will be available for small business owners to get more information on accessing financial support at the local, state, and federal levels.

Rose Marine (Moddy) Barton 1932-2020



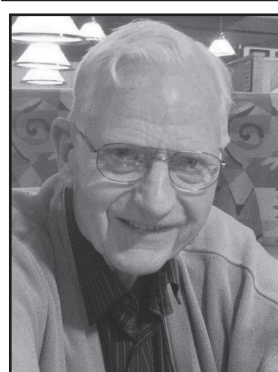

Myron "Dale" Payne 1930-2020



Myron "Dale" Payne, born June 30, 1930, in North Platte, Nebraska, passed from this world into eternity on March 24, 2020, in Stayton, Oregon. His wife Karyle was by his side.

Dale lived in North Platte until age 16 when his parents, John and Pauline Payne, moved the family to Oregon. He found work immediately at gas stations and owned a station in Yoncalla with his brother Darrell Payne. Dale always had work. He became head sawyer in one of the many sawmills in the area. Due to his math skills, his team could cut more cross beams out of a log than any mill around. As a young man Dale was attracted to the excitement of the rodeo and participated in the bucking bronco events. He later blamed what few old age aches and pains he had on the rodeo.

Dale married his youthful sweetheart, Verla Highley, in October of 1947 at the age of 17. They lived in Yoncalla, where they raised their two children, Janelle and Clayton. During this time, Dale studied for his G.E.D. and received his diploma along with his sister Diviana at her high school graduation in Yoncalla, class of 1962, at the age of 32. He went on to earn a master's degree in education at the University of Oregon. He lived in Cottage Grove and taught school in Dorena, Oregon. Later he attended real estate school and became a successful broker, managing his own business in Cottage Grove for several

years.

Dale had a good head for business and was very politically motivated, generously supporting the Southern Poverty Law Assoc., American Civil Liberties Union, Doctors without Borders, Outreach International, Graceland University, Oregon Public Broadcasting and the candidates of his choice. He was an avid reader and studied the deeper issues of theology, always ready to debate politics or theology with anyone who would listen. Dale was a member, and in earlier years served as a minister, of the Community of Christ attending in Cottage Grove and most recently in Salem.

Dale married his present wife Karyle in Hawaii on March 12, 2010. They made their home in Stayton, Oregon, where she remains.

Dale was preceded in death by his parents; wife Verla; daughter Janelle Hetherington and son-in-law Jim Hetherington; grandson David Hetherington; and siblings Darrell (Betty) Payne, Radine Rychard, and Marilyn (Perk) Parrish. He is survived by his wife Karyle; son Clayton (Kathy) Payne; youngest sister Vivian (Jerry) Nash; brother-in-law Don Rychard; grandchildren Krissy (Tim) Morgan, Laura Hetherington, Jon Hetherington, Steven Hetherington, James Hetherington, Carmen (Matt) Allan, and Nicholas (Stefanie) Payne; and 14 great-grandchildren.
