Climate Action Cottage Grove continues climate education presentations Friday

In March, with growing concern over the risk of COVID-19 infection posed by public gatherings, the organizers of the Climate Action Town Hall decided to postpone the event as well as a planned series of follow-up events and work sessions until the danger to the public had passed.

However, even during an ongoing pandemic, Climate Action Cottage Grove believes finding solutions to the environmental crisis facing the planet and its impacts on the local community is still essential.

Utilizing the virtual meeting technology of Zoom, the group will present the first in a series of educational talks on "climate collapse" this Friday, May 8, from 7 to 8:30 p.m.

"Climate Change Here, There, and Everywhere: Understanding the Science to Create A Regenerative Future for All," with presenter Tao Orion, will provide an overview of the science of climate change, looking at how humanity has impacted the environment and how that information can be used to chart a course towards a just and regenerative future for human and non-human communities in this region and beyond. Orion is the co-owner

of Resilience Permaculture Design, LLC, a firm to attend the Zoom prespecializing in holistic farm, forest, water management and restoration planning. She is the author of "Beyond the War on Invasive Species: A Permaculture Approach to Ecosystem Restoration" (2015).

She holds a degree in agroecology and sustainable agriculture from UC Santa Cruz, and grows fruits, vegetables, seeds, nuts, animals and soil on her southern Willamette Valley homestead, Viriditas Farm.
