

 Each word will fit into one spot in the grid. Use the starting letters as a guide and fit each word into its spot. All words will be used, so cross off each one after you put it into the grid.




Even Exchange by Donna Pettman





Differences: 1. Fence slat is missing. 2. Window is added. 3. Book is upside down. 4. Steak is missing.








Answers: Top to bottom, left to right: Lack, lace, lane, lank, line, link, lick, lice.




A WORD BRIDGE!




