Phase 1 includes stabilizing Stony Point, softening the sharp curves along this segment of road, and widening the

Construction work for Phase 1 is scheduled to begin June 22.

Lane County is contracting with Marcum and Sons to stabilize the road near Stony Point to prevent future sliding and shifting of the road.

This will require addressing three different landslides in a 2,500-foot section of road and installing a retaining wall

Highway project is about will excavate and replace the landslides with soil and flexible mesh (geotextile) material to create reinforced soil. The new road will be constructed on top of the reinforced temporary traffic signals. soil and retaining wall.

DMV appointment requests top 100,000 across Oregon

Vehicles (DMV) started accepting requests for in-person appointments at its offices. As of June 11, DMV has and scheduled 26,325 appointments for Orego-

By that Friday, June 5, the figure surpassed 100,000 requests.

Another 40,000 customers have received at least one phone call attempt by a DMV appointment scheduler.

"The number of requests is high after nearly three months of pent-up demand," said DMV Administrator Tom McClellan. "We processed as many requests as we received for the day, which is a great sign that we've ramped up appropriately. We will continue adding offices and appointment slots, and increase our capacity to set appointments in the days ahead."

On June 2, Oregon DMV received 11,678 Department of Motor new appointment requests through its online form, resulting in 30,690 customers awaiting an initial call back.

The average wait time received 98,361 requests is 4-5 days for the initial contact by DMV, and the calls are made in the order that request forms are received.
